"The Spot" Feature

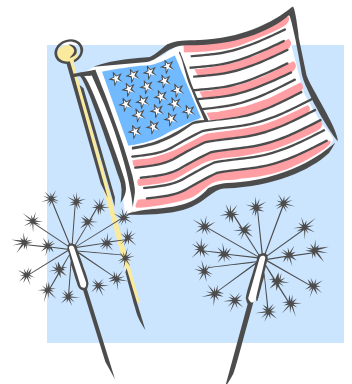
